RHIANNON GIDDENS & FRANCESCO TURRISI BRING GRAMMY-WINNING FOLK TO JORGENSEN

Hailed as “the new voice and new face of American folk music” (*NPR*), eight time nominated, and **two-time Grammy Award-winning singer-songwriter and multi-instrumentalist Rhiannon Giddens** brings her powerful, passionate vocals, spectacular banjo playing, and heartfelt lyrics to the main stage at UConn’s Jorgensen Center for the Performing Arts on **Saturday evening October 8**. Accompanied by **Grammy Award-winning keyboardist and multi-instrumentalist Francesco Turrisi**, Giddens will perform selections from her 2022 Grammy Award-winning Best Folk Album *They’re Calling Me Home*. Cowritten and recorded with Turrisi on a small farm outside of Dublin during the recent pandemic lockdown, the music speaks of the longing for the comfort of home as well as the metaphorical “call home” of death, which has been a tragic reality for so many during the COVID-19 crisis.

A MacArthur “Genius Grant” recipient, Giddens says her lifelong mission is to lift up people whose contributions to American musical history have previously been erased and to work toward a more honest and accurate understanding of our country’s musical origins. *Smithsonian Magazine* calls Giddens “an electrifying artist who brings alive the memories of our forgotten musical predecessors, white and black.”

The concert is one of several events that will be hosted by Jorgensen Center in homage to the UConn Women’s Center’s 50th anniversary. From October 8 to December 9, the Jorgensen Gallery will present *Celebration! A New Chapter for the M. Estelle Sprague Collection*, that highlights the changing silhouette of women’s dress from the early nineteenth to twenty-first centuries, as well as garments donated by women who were UConn administrators and alumnae. Curated by Susan J. Jerome,

Jorgensen will host an opening reception at 6pm on October 8. Patrons of Rhiannon Giddens/Francesco Turrisi and the general public are invited to attend.

Doors open at 7:30pm. Concert begins at 8:00pm.
